Shape California's Adaptation Agenda

- Participate in discussions with ARCCA member regional collaboratives throughout the state, as well as individual members of collaboratives (a diverse blend of public, private, non-profit, academic, and community-based organizations). ARCCA members represent significant influencers in California's adaptation space who are focused on identifying solutions to the state's most pressing climate change issues. In addition to ARCCA's quarterly invite-only meetings, ARCCA often organizes targeted calls and meetings to discuss funding opportunities, important legislation, and strategies to accelerate progress on adaptation. - Engage with ARCCA's leadership team to help shape ARCCA's annual strategic priorities to further the network's shared goals. Current strategic priorities include exploring opportunities to create or grow adaptation funding sources, and strengthening the urban-rural connection. Additionally, Affiliate members have the potential to act on these strategies through coordination with ARCCA and its members on joint fundraising proposals, special projects, and advocacy efforts.
- Participate in ARCCA's established policy engagement process in response to California's adaptation-related policies, funding guidelines, and planning guidance. With deep connections to key state agencies and a strong reputation, ARCCA's comments are carefully considered and members frequently have opportunities for early review and input before drafts are publicly released. ARCCA's participation in state dialogue resulted in the inclusion of ARCCA as a resource in the Climate Change Research Plan for California, Executive Order B-30-15 supplementary materials, Safeguarding California: Implementation Action Plans, and more.

- Connect with key state agencies that regularly engage and participate in ARCCA’s initiatives and meetings, and partner with regional collaboratives on workshops and resource development. Key state agencies that ARCCA has a strong relationship with include, but are not limited to:

Enhance Your Organization’s Visibility

- Take advantage of an annual dedicated opportunity to share your organization’s programs, tools, resources, and offerings to a statewide audience – often hundreds of participants - in an ARCCA-hosted Learning Session webinar. In addition to leading one Learning Session directly, all Learning Sessions include all affiliate member logos.
- Highlight your organization’s programs, tools, and reports on a dedicated page on the ARCCA website. Affiliate members also have an opportunity to partner with ARCCA members to develop case studies for ARCCA’s website and submission to the ICARP Adaptation Clearinghouse.
